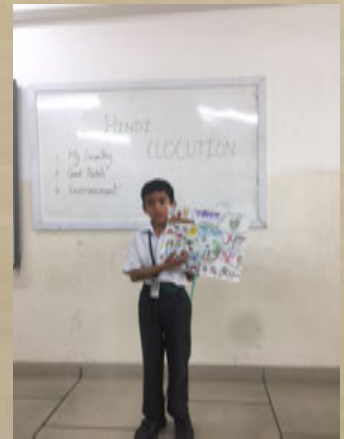


## SPORTS DAY

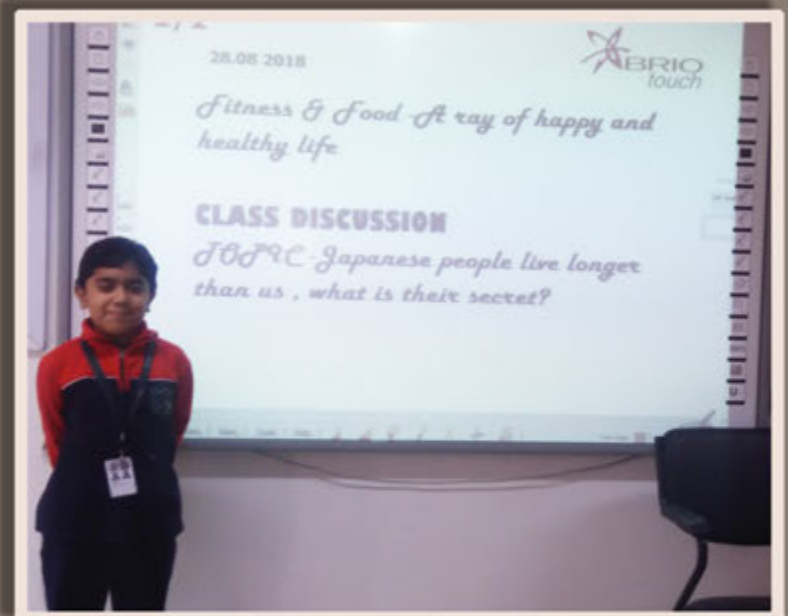
## A Child Within
