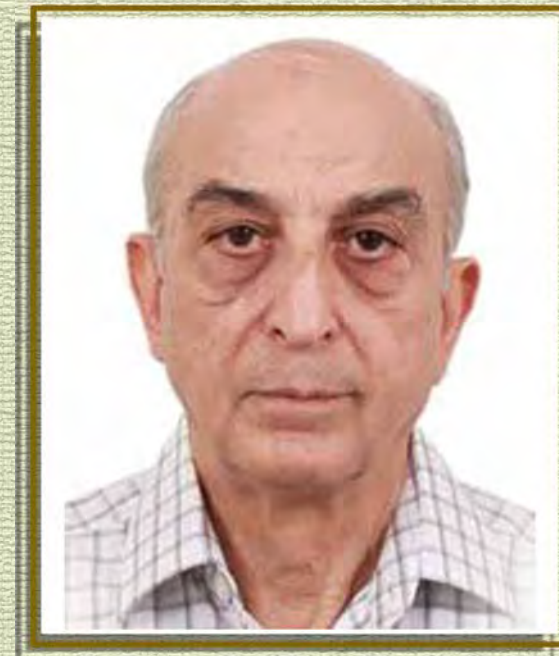

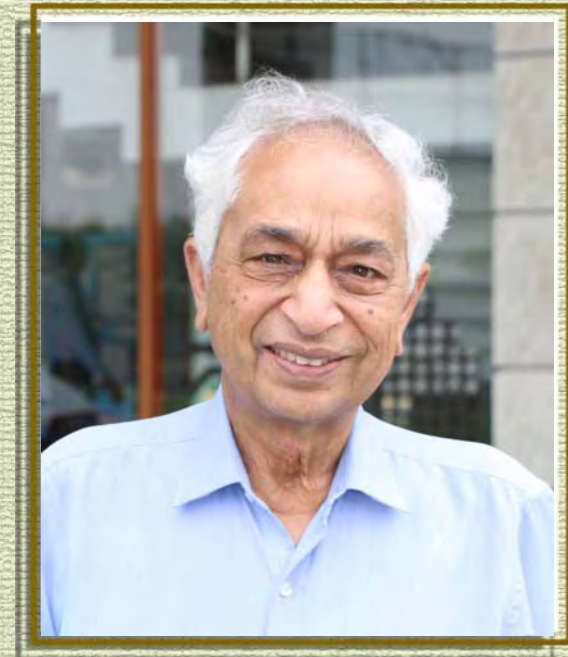


Kaleidoscope Of Zeal And Passion.....

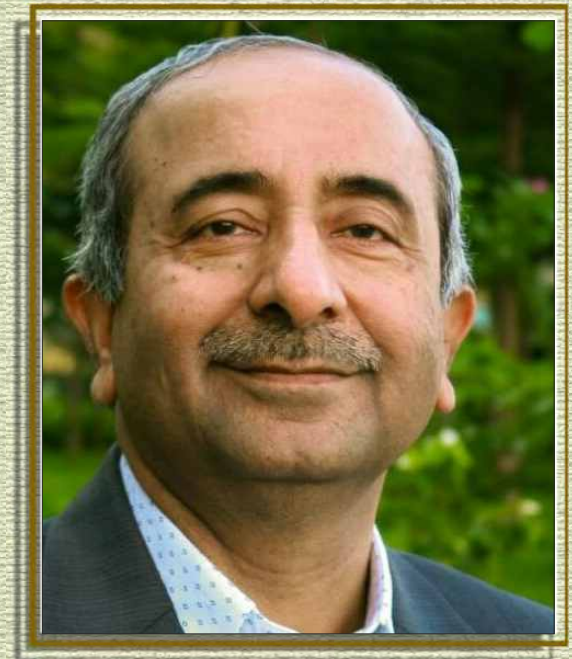


Nurturing innate potential...

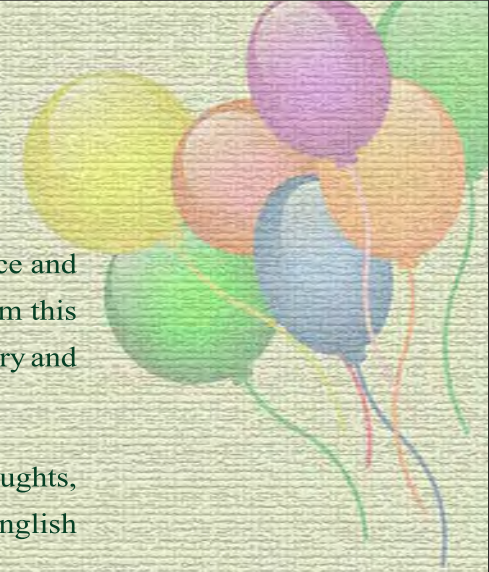


RHYME AND RHYTHM

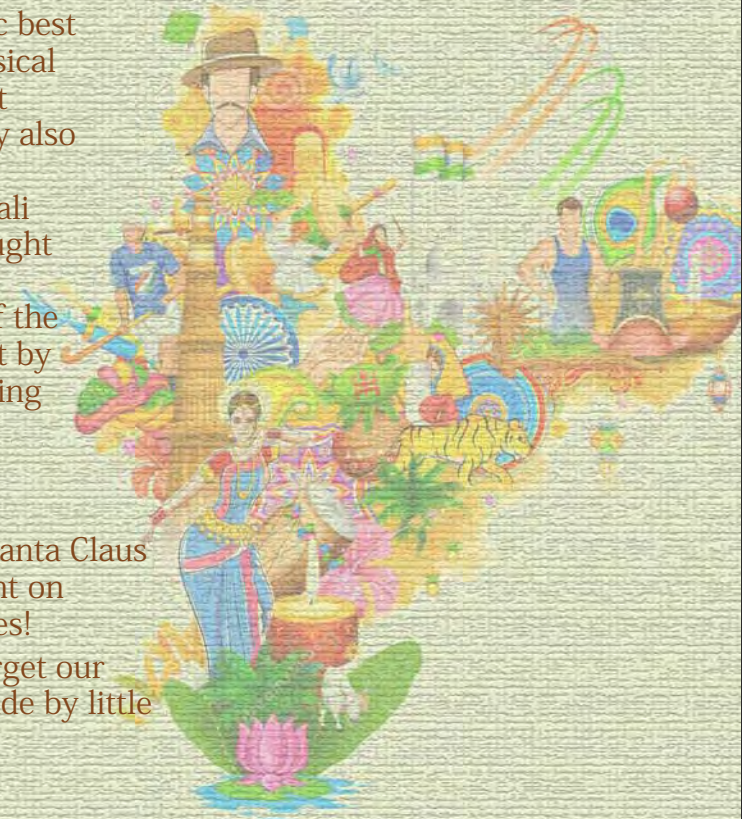
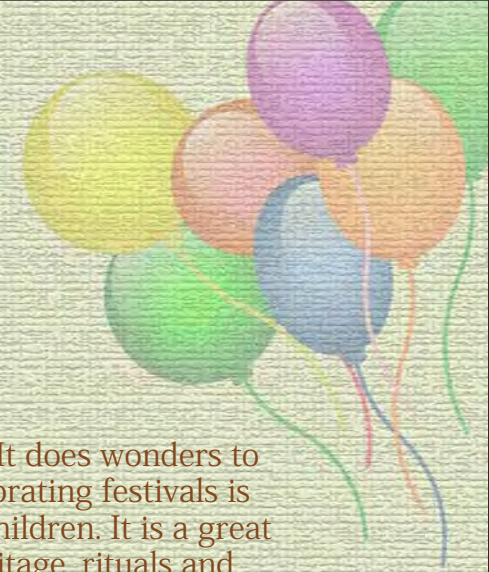

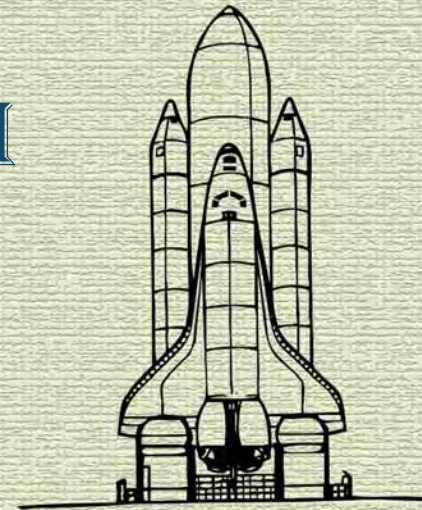


SPACE WORKSHOP- CLASSES I&II

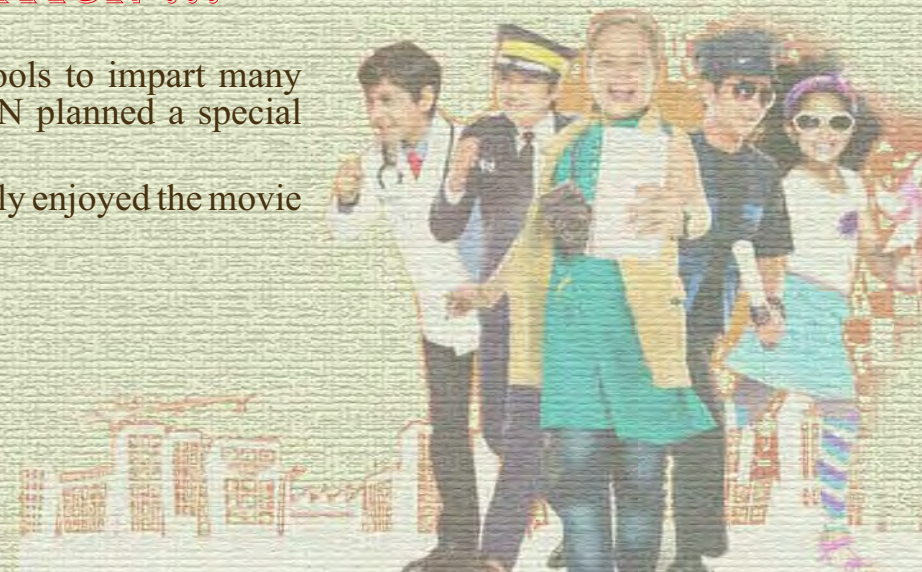
SCREENING OF POORNA

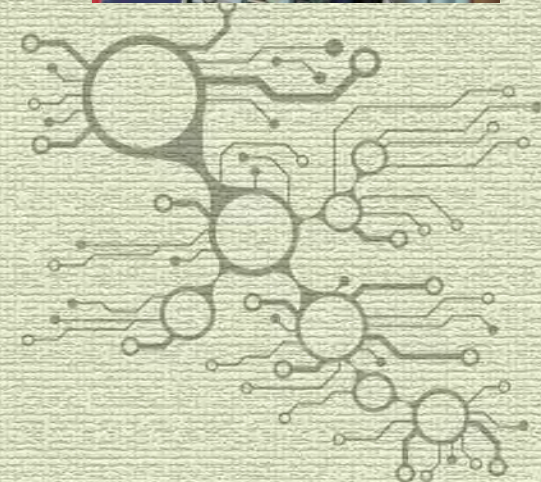
In order to celebrate the power of technology and innovation, the Primary Wing of DPS, GBN observed Techno Week from August 22 to August 25, 2017.

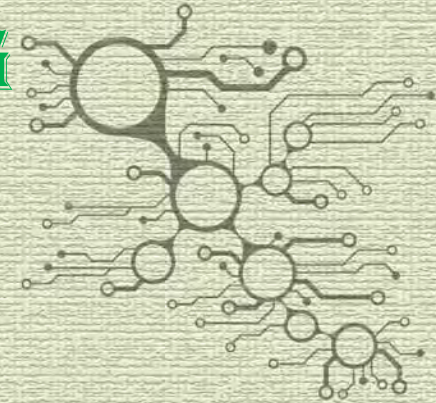

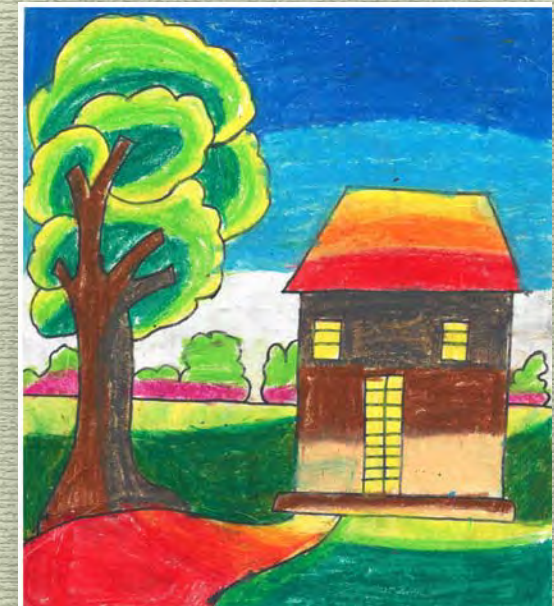

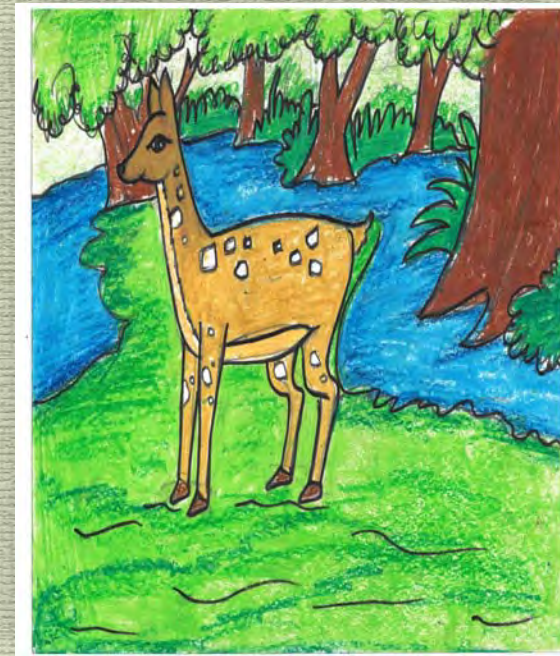

FAQS ABOUT SCHOOL COUNSELLING

Students today lack a sense of direction, purpose and fulfilment; and may indulge in activities harmful to not only themselves but to society as well. Adequate guidance and counselling facilities, is the only answer to help and guide the students towards realizing their goals of optimum academic, personal and social development.

Here are some of the most commonly asked questions by parents, about school counsellors, the counselling process and particular academic concerns.

Q1) What is the work of a school counsellor?

A school counsellor's primary focus is to help make learning a positive experience for every student. We focus on the areas of academic development, personal/social development, and career awareness and exploration. Counsellors facilitate communication among teachers, parents, administrators, and students to adapt the school's environment to the best interests of each individual student. We help individual students make the most of their school experiences and prepare them for the future by helping every student develop abilities of self-understanding, decision-making, life planning and action-taking to be able to adjust in the career options he or she decides to pursue. We work with all students, either individually, in small groups or with whole classes.

Q2) How do I recognize if my child is a slow-learner?

A slow learner is a child or pupil who is able to learn educational skills but at a rate and depth below average as compared to the child's peers - average learners - in the class. Normally, learners have an IQ of 85-115. Learners who have an IQ below 70 are termed as having intellectual disability. A slow learner has not reached the level of being termed as having intellectual disability (mental retardation).

Some of the characteristics of slow learners is that they have a hard time grasping new concepts quickly even though they tend to work hard. They usually go out of their way to solve challenging mathematical calculations and subjects which are beyond their capabilities. They exhibit low self-esteem due to the knowledge they do not perform well.

Q3) What is a learning disability?

Learning disabilities are neurologically-based processing problems. These problems can interfere with learning basic skills such as reading, writing and/or math. They can also interfere with higher level skills such as organization, time planning, abstract reasoning, long or short term memory and attention. Learning disabilities can affect an individual's life beyond academics and can impact relationships with family, friends and in the workplace.

Learning disabilities should not be confused with learning problems which are primarily the result of visual, hearing, or motor handicaps; of mental retardation; of emotional disturbance; or of environmental, cultural or economic disadvantages.

People with learning disabilities are generally of average or above average intelligence. There often appears to be a gap between the individual's potential and actual achievement. Learning disabilities are referred to as "hidden disabilities" because the person looks perfectly "normal" and seems to be a very bright and intelligent person, yet may be unable to demonstrate the skill level expected from someone of a similar age. Since difficulties with reading, writing and/or math are recognizable problems during the school years, the signs and symptoms of learning disabilities are most often diagnosed during schooling.



Q4) What is the cure? Do the counsellors provide a solution for it?

A learning disability cannot be cured or fixed; it is a lifelong challenge. However, with appropriate support and intervention, people with learning disabilities can achieve success in school, at work, in relationships, and in the community.

Counsellors can provide resources where the parents can get a diagnosis and, in school we support the academic progress of the child by providing helpful concessions during tests and by providing study support where it is required.

Q5) Do school counsellors make mental health diagnoses? Will my child be labelled if he/she is visiting with the counsellor?

School counsellors do not make mental health diagnoses. However, we do use direct observation, input from parents and teachers, and information from the student to create an illustration of the student in the school environment. This information is shared with the teachers to develop strategies to help the student to be more successful in a school setting. In case we feel that there may be clinical issues interfering with the child's learning, we help the parents with information on where testing can be conducted and a diagnosis provided.

We follow strict protocols and ethical standards. The information shared within a counsellor's office is not shared with anyone outside. The action plan is shared with only the required parties under strict confidence. This prevents a child from being "labelled". We also conduct regular sensitisation workshops with the staff to ensure that the faculty is understanding of, and supportive to the child's difficulties.

Q6) Are counsellors available to assist students with grief or trauma?

School counsellors are concerned for students as individuals and for their preparedness to learn and be successful in the school setting. Grief and trauma create roadblocks to the brain's readiness to learn. We work with students on how to process grief and provide resources for families should the nature of the grief need further attention. The student will be provided with the emotional tools required for him/her to overcome the grief and reach a state of acceptance where his mind can re-focus on the task of academic performance.
